# New RBN Traditional Council sworn-in

New members of the RBN Traditional Council were sworn in at the council chamber in Phokeng on Thursday, 28 September during a special supreme council sitting. Seven (7) of the councillors were elected by the community while ten (10) were appointed by Kgosi as prescribed in legislation.

The new council that pledged to discharge their duties with honour and dignity were sworn in by magistrate Ronnie Rampe, in the presence of Kgosi, Dikgosana, Bakhuduthamaga and members of their respective Makgotla as well as the RBA Executive Management.

Traditional Council is established in terms of the Traditional Leadership and Framework Act, 41 of 2003, North West Traditional Leadership Act 2 of 2005 and in conjunction with the by-laws and customs of the Royal Bafokeng Nation (RBN). The roles and responsibilities of the Traditional Council are therefore fully guided by both these legislations and RBN by-laws.

Since the council took office a month ago, the office of the Secretariat has been working tirelessly coordinating induction to support them in their role as new members of the supreme council.

The new traditional council as appointed to serve for a five year term are ready and eager to begin with their work. But what exactly is their role?

In terms of Act 41 of 2003, the roles of Traditional Council are set as follows;

- Administering the affairs of the traditional community in accordance with customs and tradition;
- Assisting, supporting and guiding traditional

- leaders in the performance of their functions;
- Supporting municipalities in the identification of community needs;
- Participating in the development of policy and legislation at local level;
- Promoting the ideals of co-operative governance, sustainable development and service delivery;
- Recommending appropriate interventions to government relating to developments and service delivery within their area of jurisdiction; and
- Performing the functions conferred by customary law, customs and statutory law consistent with the constitution.

Traditional Council has a further role to play in portfolio committees, which are established in line with the RBN focus areas (Health, Education, Infrastructure development, Security, Finance and economic development, Land and environment, etc.)

Their role in the committees will thus be comprised of the following;

- Development of policies
- Development of by-laws
- Approval of budgets
- And an oversight function (review, monitoring and evaluation of performance and actions of entities)

It is anticipated that the newly elected members who are mostly youth will bring new insights and developments to the new council and tirelo morafe.

A young entrepreneur Kitso Molefe from Dithabaneng Section, Phokeng is a proud winner of this year's regional Pitch & Polish annual entrepreneurial competition. The programme sponsored by ENGEN is designed to give smaller, local communities access to expert guidance and input on how to polish their business pitches.

RBED has been part of this programme as a local partner for the past three years, exposing SMMEs to these modern ways of successfully pitching their ideas to potential investors. The 2017 Rustenburg region Pitch and Polish was special in a way, as Kitso Molefe, one of the young local entrepreneurs, appointed from the floor to join the contestants, won the competition.

Molefe who missed the deadline to apply online to be the contestant, was appointed from the floor together with other three nominees to pitch their businesses for the spot to become the official contestants; he won by audience votes.

He was the crowd's favourite with his unusual business idea of creating mobile apps that assist learners to excel in their Maths and Science subject. He was crowned the Rustenburg region winner, which qualifies him to compete for the National Pitch and Polish 2017 title to be held in Johannesburg from 21 – 24 November 2017 (Semi-finals) and the finals on the 30th November if he makes it through the semis. # Water Quality –Ga-Luka village

The water in Luka is safe for human consumption. This was confirmed by the latest results conducted by three independent laboratories and the water board. The water testing was done following a complaint by a resident of Luka village regarding the taste, color and smell of the drinking water.

Upon receiving a complaint, the Water and Sanitation unit within the department of Infrastructure initiated a water quality sampling and testing investigation to follow up on the validity of the complaint and necessary action to be taken.

The testing started on 11 July, with three independent laboratories: QualitySure, Aquatico and Integral laboratories together with Rand Water Board taking samples at three different locations in Luka village. The sampling points were identified as:

- the Rand Water Sampling point, representing water quality before entering the Luka Reservoir
- At the Luka Reservoir, representing water quality in the Luka Reservoir before distribution to the Village

- At the house of the complainant, representing water quality at point of use in the Village.

The three water samples were taken by all four parties for testing in three consecutive weeks. The first samples were taken on 25 July, followed by second samples on the 1 August and the last samples on 8 August.

All water samples, were sampled and transported in accordance with standard procedures and tested for all determinants as listed in the South African National Standard – Drinking Water Part, i.e. Microbiological, Physical, Aesthetic and chemical determinants. (SANS 241:2015).

All Results were presented independently by the four testing entities.

Royal Bafokeng Administration is proud to announce that, based on the analysis; the water received, stored and distributed to Luka village is fit for human consumption. This means that, chemically and microbiologically (that which can be tested in a Laboratory), the water



is within the limits prescribed by the South African National Standard for Drinking Water. The water poses no health risk. Aesthetically, the water tested showed no signs of Turbidity, Smell or Color.

# Royal Bafokeng Institute Post-School TVET Graduation

The RBI held its fourth uniform Post-School Technical and Vocational Education and Training Graduation Ceremony on 13 October at the Conference Centre in Phokeng. A total of 292 deserving students qualified to receive awards spread across 13 qualifications offered between Maile Campus, Phokeng Campus and the Hospitality Campus based at Ananda Lodge.

RBI CEO Tom Hamilton officially opened the graduation ceremony attended by nearly 700 guests and students. In his resilient key note address, he said it took him 148 times to apply for a job before he was successful in landing his first job. Students should not lose hope in finding their dream job but must keep on applying. The graduating students were praised for their persistence in completing their qualifications successfully.

Mmemogolo Semane Molotlegi embraced the graduation with her presence and she also addressed the audience with a powerful message. Mmemogolo advised that nothing in life is for free, not even the water being distributed during the event. Students must work hard to be the best in what they can be.

Phokeng Campus had 92 students receiving awards in the Department of Higher Education NATED programme Electrical Engineering N1 – N3. Maile Campus had 15 students from the Community House Building class group receiving CETA Certificates, 23 Construction apprenticeship students received RBI training confirmation letters whilst they are in the process of conducting trade testing. Another 77 Short Skills Carpentry students and 73 Short Skills Bricklaying students also received RBI training confirmation letters whilst awaiting the CETA certificates.

The Hospitality Campus had 9 students receiving City & Guilds Certificates. A total of 7 of the 9 Hospitality students are participating in learnerships abroad and are placed at Hotels such as Kalahari and Fairmont Austen in the USA.

Chidika Motshedisi - Best Student in Electrical Engineering N1 with 3 distinctions, Mosito Solomon Ntate - Best Student in Electrical Engineering N2 with 3 distinctions, Duba Oageng Timeira - Best Student in Electrical Engineering N3 with a distinction and Thapelo Masimong- Best Student in Hospitality with a distinction.

Other best performing students include: Samuel Seabele Mashaba - Best Student in Community House Building 15.1, Thapelo Joseph Ncobe - Best Student in Apprenticeship 43 Bricklaying, Thapelo Donald Ramollo - Best Student in Apprenticeship 43 Carpentry, Andries Rapula Moloto - Best Student in Apprenticeship 43 Painting & Decorating, Vincent Nkoana - Best Student in Apprenticeship 43 Plumbing, Jacob Sentereng Radiokana - Best Student in Short Skills Programme Bricklaying, Bakang Christina Maledu - Best Student in Short Skills Programme Carpentry,

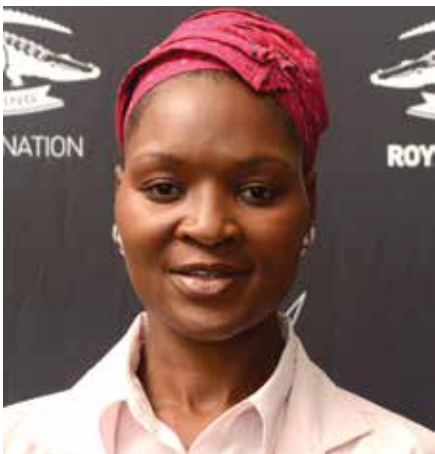

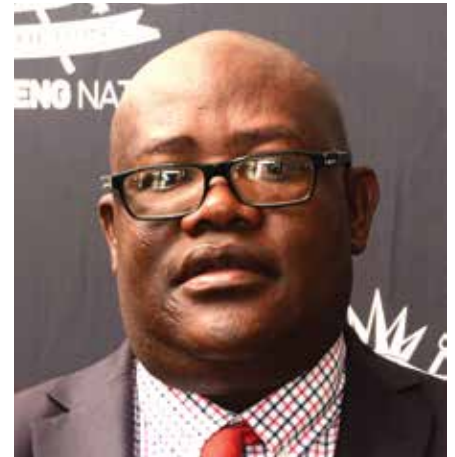

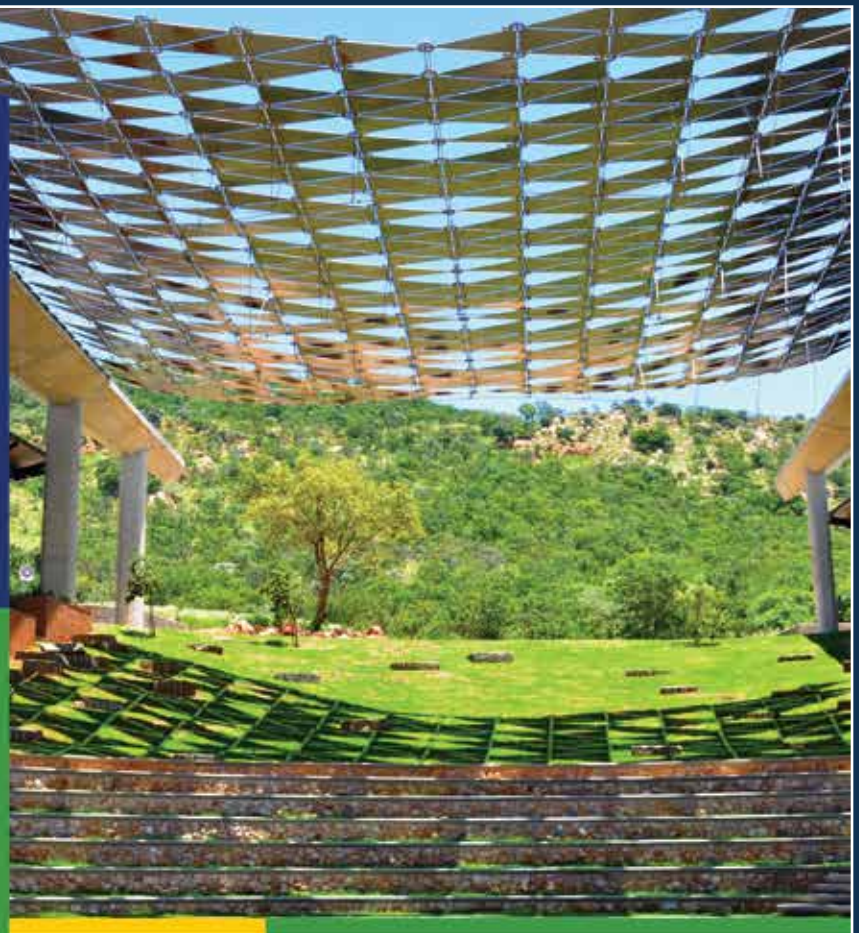
